

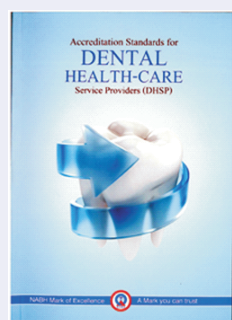
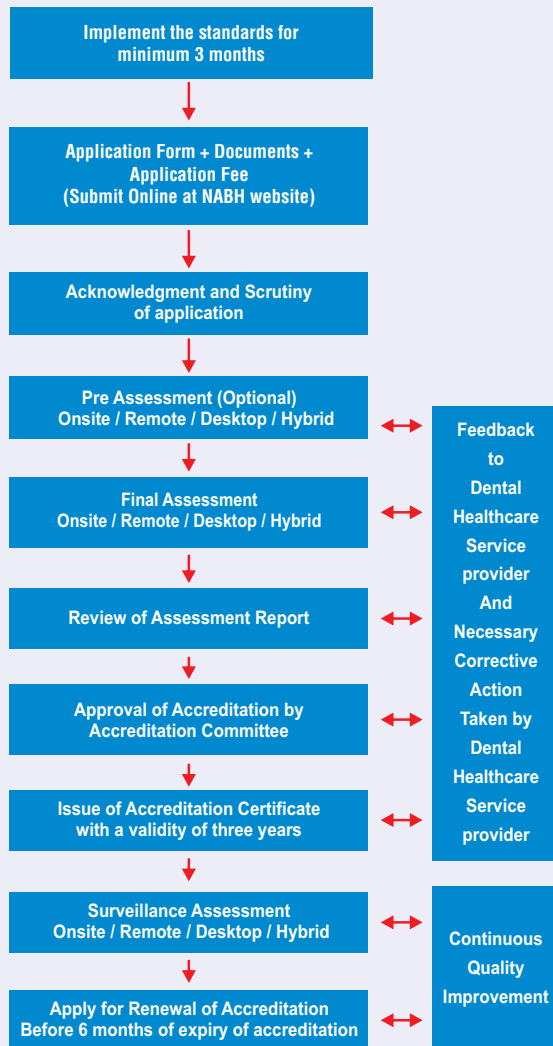

Introduction to NABH: National Accreditation Board for Hospitals and Healthcare Providers (NABH) is a constituent board of Quality Council of India (QCI) which is established with a vision to be the apex national healthcare accreditation and quality improvement body, functioning at par with global benchmarks. NABH as an organization is accredited by the International Society for Quality (ISQua) and is an institutional member of ISQua and ASQua.

Dental Accreditation : The NABH accreditation program for Dental facilities/clinics was started in the year 2010. This programme has been receiving tremendous response and willingness from the dental fraternity including prominent government and private dental establishments for upgrading the dental facilities / clinics in order to ensure patient safety and quality care.

Benefits of Accreditation

- ❖ Patients are the biggest beneficiary as implementation of accreditation standards ensures Patient safety, commitment to quality care resulting in good clinical outcomes.
- ❖ Improves patient satisfaction and increases community confidence as services are provided by credentialed medical staff.
- ❖ Accreditation status provides good marketing advantage in the competitive healthcare including promotion of medical tourism.
- ❖ Accreditation provides an objective system of empanelment by insurance and other third parties

Who can apply?

Dental Healthcare Service Provider (DHSP) that fulfils the following requirements:

- ❖ Currently in operation as a Dental Healthcare Service Provider (DHSP).
- ❖ Dental Healthcare Service Provider should have implemented NABH standards for a minimum of three months.
- ❖ The organization that commits to comply with NABH standards and applicable legal/statutory/ regulatory requirements.
- ❖ Dental Healthcare Service Provider standards has two separate sections for accreditation of hospitals and clinics as follows:

Section A: Dental facilities associated with hospitals with or without inpatient beds including educational institutes.

Section B: Dental Clinics and Centres up to 11 chairs

How to apply for accreditation?

All aspiring Dental Healthcare Service Provider desirous to achieve accreditation can apply online by registering on the NABH website. Kindly refer the General information brochure in the Dental accreditation page on NABH website.
